A Resolution of the City of Plano, Texas, ordering a bond election to be held in the City of Plano, Texas, making provisions for the conduct of the election and resolving other matters incident and related to such election.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Plano, Texas (the "City") hereby finds that an election should be held to determine whether said governing body shall be authorized to issue bonds of said City in the amounts and for the purposes hereinafter identified; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PLANO, TEXAS:

SECTION I: An election shall be held on the 3rd day of May, 2025, in the City of Plano, Texas, which date is not less than seventy-eight (78) nor more than ninety (90) days from the date of the adoption hereof and is a uniform election date pursuant to Texas Election Code, Section 41.001, for the purpose of submitting the following measures:

CITY OF PLANO, TEXAS PROPOSITION A

"Shall the City Council of the City of Plano, Texas, be authorized to issue general obligation bonds of the City in the principal amount of \$316.470.000 for permanent public improvements and public purposes, to wit: developing, engineering, constructing, reconstructing, improving, repairing, extending, expanding and enhancing streets, thoroughfares, bridges, intersections and other public ways, including participation in joint projects with federal, state and local public entities and agencies, computerized signalization and monitoring equipment and other traffic controls, grade separations, street lighting, noise abatements, necessary and related storm drainage facilities and improvements, and the acquisition of any needed land and rights-of-way therefor; such bonds to mature serially or otherwise over a period not to exceed FORTY (40) years from their date. to be issued and sold in one or more series at any price or prices and to bear interest at any rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable or otherwise) as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council at the time of issuance or sale of the bonds; and to cause to be imposed, assessed and collected annual ad valorem taxes, within the limitations prescribed by law, on all taxable property in the City sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on and to provide a sinking fund to redeem the bonds as they become due?"

CITY OF PLANO, TEXAS PROPOSITION B

"Shall the City Council of the City of Plano, Texas, be authorized to issue general obligation bonds of the City in the principal amount of \$155,155,000 for permanent public improvements and public purposes, to wit: constructing, renovating, improving, expanding, furnishing and equipping the police headquarters and the acquisition of any needed land and rights-of-way therefor; such bonds to mature serially or otherwise over a period not to exceed FORTY (40) years from their date, to be issued and sold in one or more series at any price or prices and to bear interest at any rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable or otherwise) as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council at the time of issuance or sale of the bonds; and to cause to be imposed, assessed and collected annual ad valorem taxes, within the limitations prescribed by law, on all

taxable property in the City sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on and to provide a sinking fund to redeem the bonds as they become due?"

CITY OF PLANO, TEXAS PROPOSITION C

"Shall the City Council of the City of Plano, Texas, be authorized to issue general obligation bonds of the City in the principal amount of \$51,000,000 for permanent public improvements and public purposes, to wit: constructing, renovating, improving, expanding, furnishing and equipping the police training center and the acquisition of any needed land and rights-of-way therefor; such bonds to mature serially or otherwise over a period not to exceed FORTY (40) years from their date, to be issued and sold in one or more series at any price or prices and to bear interest at any rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable or otherwise) as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council at the time of issuance or sale of the bonds; and to cause to be imposed, assessed and collected annual ad valorem taxes, within the limitations prescribed by law, on all taxable property in the City sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on and to provide a sinking fund to redeem the bonds as they become due?"

CITY OF PLANO, TEXAS PROPOSITION D

"Shall the City Council of the City of Plano, Texas, be authorized to issue general obligation bonds of the City in the principal amount of \$37,485,000 for permanent public improvements and public purposes, to wit: constructing, renovating, improving, repairing, rehabilitating and equipping public safety facilities and the acquisition of any needed land and rights-of-way therefor; such bonds to mature serially or otherwise over a period not to exceed FORTY (40) years from their date, to be issued and sold in one or more series at any price or prices and to bear interest at any rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable or otherwise) as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council at the time of issuance or sale of the bonds; and to cause to be imposed, assessed and collected annual ad valorem taxes, within the limitations prescribed by law, on all taxable property in the City sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on and to provide a sinking fund to redeem the bonds as they become due?"

CITY OF PLANO, TEXAS PROPOSITION E

"Shall the City Council of the City of Plano, Texas, be authorized to issue general obligation bonds of the City in the principal amount of \$45,135,000 for permanent public improvements and public purposes, to wit: constructing, renovating, improving, expanding, furnishing and equipping the fleet operations center and the acquisition of any needed land and rights-of-way therefor; such bonds to mature serially or otherwise over a period not to exceed FORTY (40) years from their date, to be issued and sold in one or more series at any price or prices and to bear interest at any rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable or otherwise) as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council at the time of issuance or sale of the bonds; and to cause to be imposed, assessed and collected annual ad valorem taxes, within the limitations prescribed by law, on all taxable property in the City sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on and to provide a sinking fund to redeem the bonds as they become due?"

CITY OF PLANO, TEXAS PROPOSITION F

"Shall the City Council of the City of Plano, Texas, be authorized to issue general obligation bonds of the City in the principal amount of \$1,870,000 for permanent public improvements and public purposes, to wit: constructing, renovating, improving, expanding, furnishing and equipping the Schimelpfenig Library and acquiring any needed land and rights of way therefor; such bonds to mature serially or otherwise over a period not to exceed FORTY (40) years from their date, to be issued and sold in one or more series at any price or prices and to bear interest at any rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable or otherwise) as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council at the time of issuance or sale of the bonds; and to cause to be imposed, assessed and collected annual ad valorem taxes, within the limitations prescribed by law, on all taxable property in the City sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on and to provide a sinking fund to redeem the bonds as they become due?"

CITY OF PLANO, TEXAS PROPOSITION G

"Shall the City Council of the City of Plano, Texas, be authorized to issue general obligation bonds of the City in the principal amount of \$40,795,000 for permanent public improvements and public purposes, to wit: constructing, renovating, developing, improving, expanding, furnishing, equipping park and recreational facilities and acquiring any needed land and rights of way therefor; such bonds to mature serially or otherwise over a period not to exceed FORTY (40) years from their date, to be issued and sold in one or more series at any price or prices and to bear interest at any rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable or otherwise) as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council at the time of issuance or sale of the bonds; and to cause to be imposed, assessed and collected annual ad valorem taxes, within the limitations prescribed by law, on all taxable property in the City sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on and to provide a sinking fund to redeem the bonds as they become due?"

SECTION II: In accordance with the provisions of an election services contract with the Collin County Elections Administrator (the "Collin County Contract") for that portion of the City located in Collin County and an election services contract to be entered into with the Denton County Elections Administrator (the "Denton County Contract") for that portion of the City located in Denton County, the election shall be conducted by the Collin County Elections Administrator and the Denton County Elections Administrator, respectively, in accordance with the provisions of the respective election services contracts (collectively, the "Contracts").

SECTION III: (a) With respect to that portion of the City located in Collin County, early voting for this election shall be conducted April 22, 2025 through April 29, 2025. The Collin County Elections Administration, 2010 Redbud Boulevard, Suite 102, McKinney, Texas 75069, is hereby designated the main early voting polling place, and Kaleb Breaux, Collin County Elections Administrator, is hereby appointed early voting clerk and shall appoint and designate deputy clerks for early voting in accordance with the Collin County Contract. Early voting for that portion of the City located in Collin County will also be conducted at the locations shown in Exhibit A and all other locations as designated by the Collin County Elections Administrator, in accordance with the Collin County Contract. For more information regarding the City early voting locations within

Collin County, please contact the Collin County Elections Department at (800) 687-8546 or www.collincountytx.gov/elections.

For purposes of processing ballots cast in early voting, the election officers for the early voting ballot board for this election shall be appointed and designated in accordance with the provisions of the Collin County Contract.

(b) With respect to that portion of the City located in Denton County, early voting for this election shall be conducted April 22, 2025 through April 29, 2025. The Denton County Elections Administration, Administrative Complex – Elections Building, 701 Kimberly Drive, Suite A111, Denton, Texas 76208, is hereby designated the main early voting polling place, and Frank Phillips, Denton County Elections Administrator, is hereby appointed early voting clerk and shall appoint and designate deputy clerks for early voting in accordance with the Denton County Contract. Early voting for that portion of the City located in Denton County will also be conducted at the locations shown in Exhibit A and all other locations as designated by the Denton County Elections Administrator, in accordance with the Denton County Contract. For more information regarding the City early voting locations within Denton County, please contact the Denton County Elections Department at (940) 349-3200 or www.elections.dentoncounty.com.

For purposes of processing ballots cast in early voting, the election officers for the early voting ballot board for this election shall be appointed and designated in accordance with the provisions of the Denton County Contract.

- **SECTION IV:** (a) Election day voting for that portion of the City located in Collin County will also be conducted at the locations shown in Exhibit B and all other locations as designated by the Collin County Elections Administrator, in accordance with the Collin County Contract. The election officers and maximum number of clerks for each voting place shall be determined and appointed in accordance with the Collin County Contract.
- (b) Election day voting for that portion of the City located in Denton County shall be conducted at the locations and the polling places designated for each election precinct as shown in Exhibit B and all other locations as designated by the Denton County Elections Administrator, in accordance with the Denton County Contract. The election officers and maximum number of clerks for each polling place shall be determined and appointed in accordance with the Denton County Contract.

On election day, the polls shall be open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

SECTION V: A voting system or systems meeting the standards and requirements of the Texas Election Code, as amended, is hereby adopted and approved for early voting by personal appearance and by mail and for election day voting.

Ballots shall be prepared in accordance with Texas Election Code, and permit electors to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the aforesaid measures which shall appear on the ballot substantially as follows:

SECTION VI: With respect to voters of the City residing in Collin County, the Central Counting Station for the tabulation and counting of ballots for this election shall be located at the Collin County Elections Administration, 2010 Redbud Boulevard, Suite 102, McKinney, Texas 75069 and the Manager, Tabulation Supervisor, Presiding Judge and Alternate Presiding Judge at such Central Counting Station shall be determined, appointed and designated in accordance with the Collin County Contract. The Manager and Presiding Judge of such Central Counting Station may appoint clerks to serve at such Central Counting Station, as provided by Texas Election Code, Section 127.006, as amended.

With respect to voters of the City residing in Denton County, the Central Counting Station for the tabulation and counting of ballots for this election shall be located at the Denton County Elections Administration, Administrative Complex – Elections Building, 701 Kimberly Drive, Suite A100, Denton, Texas 76208 and the Manager, Tabulation Supervisor, Presiding Judge and Alternate Presiding Judge at such Central Counting Station shall be determined, appointed and

designated in accordance with the Denton County Contract. The Manager and Presiding Judge of such Central Counting Station may appoint clerks to serve at such Central Counting Station as provided by Texas Election Code, Section 127.006, as amended.

SECTION VII: This election shall be held and conducted in accordance with the provisions of Texas Election Code and Texas Government Code, Chapter 1251, and to the extent required by law, all election materials and proceedings shall be printed in both English and Spanish.

SECTION VIII: Notice of election, including a Spanish translation thereof, shall be published on the same day in each of two successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the City, the first of these publications to appear in such newspaper not more than 30 days, and not less than 14 days, prior to Election Day. Moreover, a substantial copy of this Resolution and the voter information attached as **Exhibit C**, including a Spanish translation thereof, shall be posted (i) at City Hall not less than 21 days prior to Election Day; (ii) at three additional public places within the City not less than 21 days prior to Election Day, (iii) in a prominent location at each polling place on Election Day and during early voting, and (iv) in a prominent location on the City's internet website not less than 21 days prior to Election Day. A sample ballot shall be posted on the City's internet website not less than 21 days prior to Election Day.

SECTION IX: In accordance with Section 3.009(b) of the Texas Election Code, the City, as of the date of the adoption of this Resolution, had outstanding an aggregate principal amount of debt equal to \$604,725,000; the aggregate amount of the interest owed on such City debt obligations, through respective maturity, totaled \$204,737,920; and the City levied an ad valorem debt service tax rate for its outstanding debt obligations of \$0.1150 per \$100 of taxable assessed valuation. Based on the bond market conditions on the date of the adoption of this Resolution, the maximum interest rate for any series of bonds authorized at the Election is 6.00% (expressed as a net effective interest rate applicable to any such series of bonds). The bonds that are the subject of this Election shall mature serially or otherwise overall a specified number of years (not more than 40 years from their date of issuance), though the City estimates that, based on current bond market conditions, such bonds will amortize over a 20-year period from their respective date of issue. The foregoing estimated interest rate and amortization period are only estimates, provided for Texas statutory compliance, and do not serve as a cap on the interest rate or the amortization period for bonds that are the subject of the Election.

SECTION X: This Resolution hereby incorporates the provisions of the Collin County Contract and the Denton County Contract, and to the extent of any conflict between this Resolution and the Collin County Contract and the Denton County Contract, the provisions of the Collin County Contract and the Denton County Contract, as applicable, shall control. The Mayor, City Manager or City Secretary or other appropriate official, is hereby authorized to correct, modify or change the Exhibits to this Resolution based upon the final locations and times agreed upon by the Collin County Elections Administrator and the Denton County Elections Administrator, as applicable, and the City.
