Subject: Parks and Recreation Proposed CY 2025-2026 CIP Budget

This memorandum is companion material to the Regular Open Meeting CIP presentation scheduled for the Plano City Council meeting on August 11, 2025.

Requested Action:

Provide direction to Parks and Recreation regarding inclusion of proposed projects totaling \$76,137,177 to the FY 2025-2026 CIP Budget.

Background:

The Department's focus when developing the list of CIP projects is on renovation of existing infrastructure, redevelopment of existing park sites, trail replacement, new trail construction, land acquisition, and correcting non-compliance issues. The recommended list of projects aligns with this focus, with the highest priority given to projects that address aging infrastructure and revitalization of existing assets. The proposed Parks and Recreation CIP budget was presented to the Parks and Recreation Planning Board on 8/5/2025 and the Planning & Zoning Commission on 8/4/2025.

The 2025-2026 Parks and Recreation CIP includes projects across five Funds. The projects are further categorized to detail the funding and project status:

Open orders – funds are encumbered in an active design or construction project.

To be awarded – design status is more than 50% and will award construction in the upcoming FY.

Response-based – projects are based on historical needs to maintain assets.

Emerging projects – the project will begin design in the upcoming FY.

RECREATION CENTER PROJECTS TOTAL - \$3,184,284

Open orders:

Tom Muehlenbeck Recreation Center Renovation - \$2,834,284

Construction in progress through December 2025. Renovation to update the facility includes updates to fire, sound, and lighting systems; replacement of roof, parking lot lights, slide and play features, exterior pool equipment and shade structure. Updates are also being made to interior paint, flooring, and interior pool deck, along with some minor building modifications.

Tom Muehlenbeck Recreation Landscape & Irrigation Renovation - \$350,000

Bid award 7/28. Construction through December 2025. Renovates the building exterior landscape, drainage and irrigation.

PARK IMPROVEMENTS PROJECTS - \$49,684,662

Open orders:

Oak Point Park and Nature Preserve \$7,675,000

Bid award pending 8/25. Construction estimated through December 2026. Improvements to be constructed include a new parking lot, new reservable pavilion and a new restroom.

Maintenance Facility \$12,904,699

Construction in progress through August 2026. This maintenance facility project replaces the Schell Maintenance Facility.

Arbor Hills Nature Preserve Park Playground Renovation \$150,000

Funding was awarded on 6/9/25 for construction plans in progress to renovate the playground. Design through March 2026. Construction is estimated to take place from July 2026 through September 2027.

Breckinridge Trail Extension \$608,745

Council award 4/28/25 for construction plans in progress for a trail connection from Bradshaw Drive to the Shiloh Road DART station. Funds reflected are part of \$4.2M TXDOT reimbursement grant for design and construction. Design through November 2026. Construction is estimated to take place from February 2027 through October 2027.

Enfield Park Restroom Buildings and Ballfields \$2,200,407

Construction in progress through April 2026. Funding is for construction of two new restroom buildings and replacement of all ballfield lighting.

High Point Restroom Renovation \$1,019,378

Construction in progress through January 2026. Funding is for construction of a new restroom building and plaza.

Longhorn Neighborhood Park Renovation \$1,282,040

Construction in progress through August 2026. The project replaces park elements, including playground equipment, shade shelter, sidewalk accessibility, drinking fountains, seating, lighting, irrigation, and landscape.

Shoshoni Landscape & Irrigation Renovation \$419,775

Bid award pending 8/11. Construction through February 2026. Funding to renovate the landscape and irrigation.

To be awarded:

Harrington Park \$2,500,000

Design 90%. Construction estimated to occur from November 2025 through March 2027. Expansion of Harrington Park to include a trail on the west side of the creek, a pedestrian bridge connecting the east and west sides of the park, replacement of existing asphalt parking lot with new, reconfigured parking, new irrigation system, new restrooms, pavilion, pickleball courts and playground improvements. Partially funded through Park Fee.

17 Land Acquisition \$1,681,390

Council approval 7/28. Planned expenditure in October 2025 for Mapleshade parcel. Partially funded through Park Fee.

Los Rios Park Trail \$100,000

Design requirements for a trail connection through Los Rios Park connecting the southernmost end of the Cottonwood Creek Greenbelt trail to the southernmost end of the Bob Woodruff Park trail. (Construction grant funded through a \$4.4M TXDOT reimbursement grant.)

Bob Woodruff Community Park North Core Renovation \$3,968,617

Design 95%. Construction estimated to occur from October 2025 through December 2026. Funding for construction to replace and relocate the playground and restroom out of the FEMA 100-year flood plain. Partially funded through Park Fee.

25 Land Acquisition \$2,250,000

Council approval 7/28. Planned expenditure in October 2025 for Mapleshade parcel. Partially funded through Park Fee. In addition, this funding is used for pending or future acquisitions.

Bob Woodruff Trail North Replacement \$1,000,000

Design 60%. Construction estimated March 2026 through December 2026. Funding to remove and replace a segment of trail north of the playground to Rowlett Creek, including a replacement bridge relocated to meet floodway requirements.

Chisholm Trail Extension \$267,428

Design 90%. Collin County Grant funds through a Collin County Open Space reimbursement grant are reflected for the portion of this trail's construction from 15th Street north to Janwood Drive. Project is primarily funded through Park Fee. Construction estimated February 2026 through December 2026.

Horseshoe Community Park Renovation \$2,000,000

100% Design. Construction is estimated to take place from November 2025 through January 2027. The project replaces park elements, including playground equipment, shade shelter, sidewalk accessibility, drinking fountains, seating, lighting, irrigation, landscape and a restroom addition. Partially funded through Park Fee.

Tejas Neighborhood Park Renovation \$2,161,876

Design 94%. Renovations and replacement of park elements, including playground equipment, shade shelter, sidewalk accessibility, drinking fountains, seating, lighting, irrigation, and landscape. Partially funded through Park Fee.

Bob Woodruff Sidewalk Connection \$450,000

Design 60%. A project to construct the sidewalk gap on Park Boulevard along this park's boundary.

Bob Woodruff North Lighting Replacement \$700,000

Design 60%. A project to remove and replace lighting around the pond.

Bruce Glasscock Park \$3,839,931

30% Design. The project will construct park improvements including regrading, walkways, retaining walls, a pavilion, landscape and irrigation.

Emerging projects:

25 Community Park Renovations \$200,000

Design services to begin master planning for a renovation at Schell Park.

21 Park Improvements \$666,876

Funding is available for continued development of parks throughout the city including sidewalks, trails, trees, playground expansions, lighting, benches, restrooms, picnic areas and other related park improvements. This includes funding to master plan or study feasibility of future parks and facilities, as well as to respond to public requests or needs that are unforeseen at the time of bond project identification.

25 Parks Maintenance Facility West \$200,000

Design services to begin master planning for a renovation/replacement of this facility.

25 Recreational Trails \$100,000

Design services to begin master planning for a trail connection project, to be determined.

Old Shepard Community Park Renovation \$100,000

Design services to complete planning and construction documents.

Mendomi Park Improvements \$230.500

Design services to begin construction documents for this project. Master planning phase is currently underway. The project will construct park improvements including regrading, walkways, retaining walls, landscape and irrigation.

Chisholm Trail Central Circle Parkway to Alma/PGBT \$180,000

Master planning is in progress. Design services to begin construction documents and plans for this project.

Los Rios to Breckinridge Trail Connection \$100,000

Funding for a study to determine feasibility and route options to a future Los Rios Park to Breckinridge Trail.

Russell Creek Pond Lighting \$10,000

A project to study feasibility and cost of lighting around Russell Creek pond.

Indian Creek Irrigation Renovation \$630,000

Design services to begin construction documents for this project to renovate the irrigation system.

Chinaberry Sidewalk at Bluebonnet Trail \$88,000

Design services and construction services to provide a sidewalk in this location.

PARK CAPITAL MAINTENANCE FUND - \$6,988,434

Response-based:

Athletic Field Renovations \$350,000

General renovation and replacements at athletic fields, including sports turf field repairs and infield conditioning.

Tree Replacements \$62,000

Replacement of trees throughout the city is annually. Monies are housed in this Fund that are collected as fees paid for trees removed.

Irrigation Renovations \$100,000

Funding to address irrigation renovations as needed.

Playground Replacement \$350,000

Replacement of aging playground equipment and surfacing to meet ADA requirements as needed.

Trail Repairs \$100,000

A project to repair trail segments as needed.

Irrigation Technology & Mechanical \$420,000

Replacement of irrigation controllers, pump systems, master valves, and backflow devices across the park system that have reached the end of their useful lives, as needed-

Park Structures & Equipment \$362,000

Repair and replace park structures and equipment, including pavilion repairs, park lighting and electrical replacements, picnic table replacements, utility repairs, trash receptacles, equipment replacements and fence replacements as needed.

Park Restoration \$160,000

Includes cleanup of illegal dumping on park land as needed, removal of structures on park land, restoration of minor areas disturbed by drainage, compaction and erosion.

Recreation Facility Replacements \$125,000

Replacement of recreation facility equipment and features that have been damaged or reached the end of their useful life as needed.

Public Building Landscape Renovations \$207,446

Replace landscape beds, shrubs, trees, irrigation systems and associated improvements at public buildings.

Pool Equipment \$475,000

Replacement of pumps, filters, pool plaster, slides and other recreational features at the pools as needed.

Lighting Replacement \$150,000

Replace athletic field lighting as needed.

Art Facilities Equipment \$201,000

Replacement of arts facilities equipment, including lighting, hardware, and soft goods. Includes design services for construction plans for and replacement of stage roof structure at Red Tail Pavilion.

Living Screen Replacements \$25,000

Replacement of right-of-way screening hedges adjacent to major thoroughfares in locations throughout the city as needed.

Pecan Hollow Golf Course Restoration \$215.000

Includes restoration of areas disturbed by drainage, compaction, and erosion. R-replacement of irrigation controllers, pump systems, master valves, and backflow devices.

High Point Tennis Center Court Resurface \$200,000

A project to resurface courts at the tennis center.

To be awarded:

Plano Aquatic Center Secured Storage \$404,110

Design 60%. A project to install a secure storage area.

Pecan Hollow Clubhouse Landscape/Irrigation Renovation \$353,000

A project to renovate the landscape and irrigation at this location.

Steeplechase Neighborhood Park Renovation \$108,000

Council award 7/28. Master plan complete. Design services for construction plans to replace park elements, including playground equipment, shade shelter, sidewalk accessibility, drinking fountains, seating, lighting, irrigation and landscape.

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Windhaven Community Park Renovation \$145,000

Council award 7/28. Master plan complete. Design services for construction plans to replace park elements, including playground equipment, shade shelter, sidewalk accessibility, drinking fountains, seating, lighting, irrigation and landscape.

Westwood Park Renovation \$107,650

Council award 7/28. Master plan complete. Design services for construction plans to replace park elements such as playground equipment, shade shelter, sidewalk accessibility, drinking fountains, seating, lighting, irrigation and landscape.

Tejas Park Renovation \$225,891

Design 94%. Construction to replace park elements such as playground equipment, shade shelter, sidewalk accessibility, drinking fountains, seating, lighting, irrigation and landscape. Project is primarily funded through Park Improvements.

Bob Woodruff North Trail Replacement \$508,969

Design 60%. Construction estimated to occur from March 2026 through December 2026. Funding to remove and replace a segment of trail north of the playground to Rowlett Creek, including a replacement bridge relocated to meet floodway requirements. Project was also funded through Park Improvements.

Emerging projects:

Plano Event Center Beverage Service Renovation \$550,000

A project to renovate and modernize the existing beverage service area.

Carpenter Recreation Center Sign Replacement \$60,000

A project to replace the monument sign at this location.

Pecan Hollow Maintenance Building Renovations \$275,000

Updates to the facility include light replacements, updating interior paint, and flooring, as well as minor building modifications.

Median Renovation \$85.868

Design services for renovating median landscape and irrigation at a location to be determined. Construction is scheduled to begin in 2026-2027.

Lone Star Irrigation Renovation \$462,500

Design and construction project to renovate the irrigation system at this location. Project extends through 2026-2027.

Shady Brook Trail Renovation at Midway \$200,000

Design services for a project to renovate closed trail at this location due to undermining from erosion.

PARK FEE PROGRAM PROJECTS - \$7.488.158

Open orders:

Longhorn Park Renovation - Area 6 \$314,000

Construction in progress through August 2026. The project replaces park elements, including the playground equipment, shade shelter, sidewalk accessibility, drinking fountains, seating, lighting, irrigation, and landscape. Primarily funded through Park Improvements.

To be awarded:

Glasscock Park Improvements - Area 14 \$78,000

30% Design. The project will construct park improvements including regrading, walkways, retaining walls, a pavilion, landscape and irrigation. Primarily funded through Park Improvements.

Mapleshade acquisition - Area 11 \$1,418,000

Council approval 7/28. Planned expenditure in October 2025 for Mapleshade parcel. Partially funded through Park Improvements.

Almanac Linear Park – Area 12 Fund level \$4,290,000

Funds to pay for the linear park land acquisition upon fulfillment of Final Plat requirements per the Park Land Reimbursement Agreement approved by Council 8/28/23.

Chisholm Trail Extension – Area 6 \$575,000

Design 90%. A trail connection between 15th Street and Janwood. Also funded through Collin County Grant funds through a Collin County Open Space reimbursement grant via Park Improvements. Construction is estimated to take place from February 2026 through December 2026.

Horseshoe Park Renovation - Area 7 \$72,209

100% Design. Construction is estimated to take place from November 2025 through January 2027. The project replaces park elements such as playground equipment, shade shelter, sidewalk accessibility, drinking fountains, seating, lighting, irrigation, landscape and a restroom addition. Primarily funded through Park Improvements.

Tejas Park Renovation – Area 4 \$108,503

Design 94%. Renovations and replacement of park elements, including playground equipment, shade shelter, sidewalk accessibility, drinking fountains, seating, lighting, irrigation, and landscape. Primarily funded through Park Improvements.

Bob Woodruff North Core Renovation – Area 1 \$127,446

Design 95%. Construction estimated to occur from October 2025 through December 2026. Funding for construction to replace and relocate the playground and restroom out of the FEMA 100-year floodplain. Primarily funded through Park Improvements.

Harrington Park Renovation - Area 6 \$330,000

Design 90%. Construction estimated to occur from November 2025 through March 2027. Expansion of Harrington Park to include a trail on the west side of the creek, a pedestrian bridge connecting the east and west sides of the park, replacement of existing asphalt parking lot with new, reconfigured parking, new irrigation system, new restrooms, pavilion, pickleball courts and playground improvements. Primarily funded through Park Improvements.

Emerging projects:

Fund level - \$175,000

Funds to engage in appraisals and land studies when needed.

DRAINAGE PROJECTS - \$8,791,639

Open orders:

Big Lake Silt Removal \$778,523

Construction in progress through February 2026.

Erosion Control - Rowlett Creek at Pecan Hollow \$3,020,000

Bid award pending. Construction is estimated to take place from October 2026 through April 2026. Funding to implement construction of erosion control improvements along Rowlett Creek at Pecan Hollow Golf Course to protect threatened golf course elements.

To be awarded:

Legacy Trail Pond Silt Removal \$1,285,000

Design 95%. A construction project to remove silt and sedimentation from the pond.

Erosion Control at Shady Brook Trail/Riverside \$450,000

5% Design. Funding to implement construction of erosion control improvements along Shady Brook Trail west of Riverside Drive to protect threatened trail.

Arbor Hills Nature Preserve Erosion Control \$1.058.116

Bid award pending 8/25. A construction project to address erosion threatening pedestrian bridge. Construction is estimated to take place from September 2025 through April 2026.

Chisholm Trail Erosion at San Simeon, Phase II \$250,000

Study in progress. Construction plans will address erosion threatening the wall in this location.

Chisholm Trail Extension Creek Bank Stabilization \$650.000

Design 90%. Stream bank component of trail connection between 15th Street and Janwood. Construction is estimated to take place from February 2026 through December 2026.

Erosion Control – Carpenter Park Loop \$150,000

5% Design. Construction of erosion control improvements at this location to protect the bank under the drive.

Chisholm Trail at Forest Creek Estates Erosion Control \$250,000

20% Design. Construction at this location to protect Chisholm Trail.

Emerging projects:

Parks Creek Erosion \$150,000

Funding to analyze and study areas of erosion as they are discovered.

Haggard Pond Restoration \$750,000

Begin design and construction of a project to remove silt and sedimentation from this pond.
