# **Bulky Collections Program**

# **Bulky Collections Current Program**

- One day per month
  - Up to 12 collections per year
- No requirement for residents to schedule

• <u>No</u> large yard trimming collections included





## **Bulky Collections Pilot Program**

Began February 2018

Approximately 4,500 homes or 6.25% of the City


Residents required to schedule by phone

Collections within 2 business days

- Residents required to schedule online or by phone


Large yard trimming collections included


- 2010 Permit Fee Schedule Last Amended

  - Recommend Updated Fee Schedule











Single Family Residential Value - \$359,232.00 - 3,742 square foot - .48/sq.ft.





### Commercial Construction Value - \$37,138.00





### Commercial Construction Value - \$76,631.00





### Commercial Construction Value - \$247,481.00




