Accessibility Regulations



- The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1991 provides and protects equal opportunity for individuals with disabilities
- Title II addresses the requirements of public agencies including the Self-Evaluation and Transition Plan, which details barriers identified and communicates an action plan for improving accessibility
- The U.S. Access Board is responsible for the development of accessibility guidelines and standards



Plano's Transition Plan History

1992- The City addressed the requirements of the ADA by performing the required Self-Evaluation, and identified areas that did not conform.

2016- The City issued an RFQ to update the Transition Plan since services, programs, and facilities had been added and the regulations had changed.

2017- Cole & Associates, Inc. was awarded the project, to be completed in 3 phases.





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
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System Integration
