

Plano Police Department Overview

- 412 sworn officers
- 185 full-time and 85 part-time civilian staff (includes 73 crossing guards)
- 178 Plano Citizen's Police Academy Alumni Association Volunteers (42 also participate in the CAPP program)
 - 18,829 hours of service were provided by Police Volunteers in 2018
- CALEA accredited law enforcement agency for over 20 years
 - Since 1992, re-accredited seven times, including in 2015 when the department also received the "Meritorious Service" award.

Plano Police Department Standard Service Index (SSI)

- Predictive formula to maintain a measureable and definable index for determining future police officer staffing needs.
- The SSI formula creates a band of acceptable staffing level between "critical" staffing, 50% available and 50 obligated time (50/50) and "ideal" staffing, 60% available and 40% obligated (60/40).
- Our Goal. To maintain staffing at the "ideal," 60% available (not on calls or traffic/citizen stops) to 40% obligated (on calls or traffic/citizen stops).
- The closer staffing gets to "critical" the more services will be delayed and diminished.
- Currently, SSI is 57% available and 43% obligated (57/43).


2018 Major Crimes per 1,000 down 0.8%

Violent crimes per 1,000 down 2.2%




Property crimes per 1,000 down 0.7%






Major Crime Rate (per 1,000) 10-Year Comparison





Violent Crime Rate (per 1,000) 10-Year Comparison






Property Crime Rate (per 1,000) 10-Year Comparison



In 2018 Total Crashes per 1,000 down 2.4%


- Crashes on US 75 are down 12%

- Fatal crashes down from 16 to 7






Total Crashes (per 1,000) 10-Year Comparison








Injury Crashes (per 1,000) 10-Year Comparison






Fatal Crashes
10-Year Comparison




